

# **Annual Report scaling4good 2022**

Our ability to reach unity in diversity will be the beauty and the test of our civilization.

~ Mahatma Gandhi

2022 proved to be one of scaling4good's most active and diverse years. Our expertise in societal transformation was sought after, leading to multiple engagements. The variety of mandates allowed us to identify successful patterns of inspiring change and transformation. We can more and more build on them, and share our insights and learnings. Collaborating with each other and our partners has become increasingly natural, strengthening our collective impact. The quality of our work was widely recognized in Switzerland, as evidenced by the fact that we receive inquiries without actively soliciting them.

However, 2022 was also a year where the overstepping of planetary boundaries continued and the social foundations globally were also shaken. In our weekly calls, we engaged in discussions about the practical implications of democracy amidst ongoing social change. We constantly posed critical questions, seeking ways to inspire this transformative shift. While we understand the importance of fostering dialogue, some of us struggle with the need for patience. Our scientific understanding of the urgent nature of climate change and biodiversity issues reinforces our belief that progress is too slow and at the same time we know that in order to shift things, we need to slow down and not act out in haste.

# **PROJECTS & MANDATES**

In 2022 we continued with 3 projects and 2 mandates. We also initiated 2 new projects for which we received funding and acquired 2 new mandates.

## Project 1: Biodiversity in Urban Settlements - continued

All our pilots have successfully completed phase 1, which involved actor and process analysis, as well as the development of an integral biodiversity promotion concept. Those pilots that already had properties have implemented initial measures to promote biodiversity and movement in their open spaces. Most pilots have started internal scaling, which includes activities such as quality and impact management. Additionally, initial discussions have taken place to prepare for scaling, and the first steps towards consolidation have been initiated. A detailed stakeholder analysis was conducted and used as a foundation for the toolbox, nationwide scaling efforts, and further project activities.



A prototype of actor-specific settlement nature toolkits was created and reviewed with the advisory group. The structure and content of all actor-oriented toolkits are currently being revised. Concept drafts for scaling and transformation theory were developed and discussed with the advisory group, as well as external experts. A learning-for-impact session has been conducted by scaling4good.

In collaboration with the company SENN, we have developed the "Indicators Biodiversity & Real Estate" for integrating biodiversity promotion in building projects. The system underwent review by experts from various disciplines, and it was featured and <u>published by the architecture journal</u> <u>Hochparterre</u>. Scaling activities for the nationwide implementation of the indicator system are currently underway.

In 2022, we had the opportunity to present our approach for a paradigm shift in the real estate industry at multiple events, which can be found on our <u>website under</u> <u>the News section</u>. Furthermore, a communication <u>film</u> was produced to support our outreach efforts."

## Project 2: Simulated Intervention Analysis for Sustainability (sim2sustain) continued

Together with our partner sim2sustain AG conducting quantitative analytics and modeling for clients, the project in scaling4good kept connecting qualitative and personal aspects with quantitative and subject-matter aspects of large-scale transformations towards systemic sustainability.

Together with our partner meso, we connected theoretical with empirical approaches to systemic sustainability. We concluded the proposal of the "Living Model", a hybrid between a "Living Lab" and its digital twin for sustainable economic systems employing experimentation and simulation. This proposal is currently under review.

In 2022, we extended our activities to education and educational research projects at two Swiss Universities of Applied Sciences. The focus of these educational activities was on teaching and employing data analytics related to sustainability, including climate change adaptation, decarbonization, and circular economies.

The reinforcement of the connections between scaling4good's methodology and sim2sustain's participative simulation process is an ongoing task because both keep evolving.

In our partner organization sim2sustain AG, our main focus together with a working group was on the extension and customization of the Insurance SDG Calculator for the use by mutual and cooperative insurers worldwide, reflecting their commitment towards their members and affinity groups. This extension included the launch to selected mutuals and cooperatives. We also kept developing the climate stress test model concept with the finance consulting company Zanders for smaller banks and insurance companies. For Hochschule Luzern, we developed and conducted the module "Sustainability Analytics" for the MSc in Applied Information and Data Sciences. Together with businessresponsibility.ch, we advised a master student utilizing natural language processing to monitor the reporting requirements stipulated by the counterproposal of the "Konzernverantwortungsinitiative". We worked together with Francesca Mancini, David Bürgisser, and the two students Sydney Oester and Julius Voelcker.

The project and company sim2sustain are led by Salomon Billeter, and they work together with several members of scalin4good.

#### Mandate 3: NBFF - continued

The NBFF (National Forum for Biological Research) is a joint venture of people from Bio Suisse, Agroscope and FiBL. In 2021 we started accompanying the NBFF and have been invited to continue our work in 2022.

The NBFF discussion platform was actively used this year, focusing on climate protection in animal husbandry.



Alongside the three sponsoring organizations, including the Research Institute of Organic Agriculture FiBL, Bio Suisse, and Agroscope, participants from practical farming, advisory services, and the industry were present. Prior to the conference, dedicated participants met on three occasions to discuss research and practical agriculture needs, with the results presented at the event.

The conference encouraged interaction, providing workshops for participants to exchange views on the climate impact of livestock. The synthesis of these discussions was then presented to the plenary, fostering active participation throughout the day's activities.

The NBFF conference served as a valuable platform for stakeholders in the organic sector to exchange ideas. It was recognized that research, extension services, and practical farming must collaborate to address the challenges of livestock farming and climate change.

While ethical aspects are crucial in food production, sustainable consumption is also essential. The plenary emphasized the need for proactive climate action in agriculture and encouraged dialogue.

To shape the future, it is important to promote cooperation between research and practice. Agroscope's and FiBL's decentralized experimental stations and numerous cooperative projects exemplify the implementation of "research for and with practice."

## Mandate 4: Stadtnatur Christoph Merian Stiftung Basel - continued

Together with our partner Odonata GmbH we continued to support the Christoph Merian Stiftung CMS with the development of their new funding priority Urban nature, with which the CMS aims to promote biodiversity in the settlement area of Basel. In 2022 we organised expert roundtable sessions to gain a more local understanding about barriers and levers and to collect the needs of the local actors.

In October a 1 day workshop "<u>Stadtatelier</u> <u>biodiverses Basel</u>" was held with almost 90 participants to create community, joint drive and some ideas about where to co-work on ideas.



A <u>film</u> about the "Stadtatelier" has been produced by MissionB and the CMS decided to run a second "Stadtatelier" in 2023.

The project is being led by Katrin Hauser and supported by Anaïs Sägesser.

## Project 5: initiative für systemische Innovation - meso - continued

In 2022, meso has grown and incorporated as a charitable association in Switzerland. The current members and contributors come from STRIDE, Demos Helsinki, Expedition Zukunft, TransCap Initiative, Dezentrum, schaefer | hansen, and scaling4good. The incorporation was accompanied by an outreach campaign over various channels including the launch of the website.

The role of an initiative for systemic innovation was further clarified, and a wider proposal was elaborated. On request, meso provided consultancy and facilitation to organizations engaged in systemic experimentation and innovation.

At the end of 2022, three pillars of activity were identified to navigate between: Systemic service provider, systemic experimentator, and lobby for systemic transformation, supported by educational activities by its members and contributions, and going forward, also by the organization itself.



# Project 6: Campus4Biodiversity - continued

The project target has been reached: Biodiversity has been incorporated into the BFH AHB and Construction curriculum. Throughout this process, a learning retrospective was conducted with the lecturers, and interviews and feedback from the students on their term papers were gathered. This valuable input helped identify areas for improvement and informed the revision of the teaching concept.

To ensure a comprehensive evaluation, the students' work was assessed by a diverse jury, and the insights gained from this experience were taken into account in refining the teaching concept. Additionally, we established a community of practice involving BFH staff and lecturers from other universities. This collaborative platform facilitated the exchange of experiences, which was highly appreciated by all participants. It provided valuable insights on how to better integrate the topic of biodiversity in their respective environments and curricula, fostering creativity and effectiveness. Moreover, Katrin Hauser presented the initial successes of the project at the BFH's Sustainability Day, specifically focusing on the theme of Thriving Spaces. The presentation emphasized the qualities of being a pioneer for Thriving Spaces, creating a connection between the project's achievements and the broader context. The ongoing collaboration between scaling4good and BFH has proven to be mutually beneficial, with both parties reaping the rewards of this partnership..

## Project 6: Sufficiency Impact Lab - new

Together with the Impact Hub Bern, dr.ruth förster beratung + training and Fabian Leuthold from Fachstelle UND we received funding from ARE to co-develop and run a Sufficiency Impact Lab. As the funding acquired was insufficient to finance the lab as originally planned, two co-creation workshops with key stakeholders were held to see where we could scale impact if we were to collaborate. Potentially a new proposal will be submitted to foundations in 2023. Different concrete actions and collaborations emerged directly out of this. Co-lead: Anaïs

#### Mandate 6: Wyss Symposium - new

Together with Impact Hub Bern we had the mandate for the design and delivery of the Wyss Symposium Hackathon and panel moderations. For this mandate we were able to draw in people as moderators from our community. Co-lead Katrin & Anaïs, contribution, Regina, Majka and people from our network. <u>More</u>

#### Mandate 7: Living Lab

We successfully submitted a proposal for a living lab upon invitation and got the contract. At the kick-off workshop it was communicated that one of the key stakeholders will leave the organisation and that the start needs to be postponed until a successor has been found.

# **REMUNERATION & FINANCIALS**

Most work was conducted as a voluntary contribution and was not remunerated. There was no one employed by scaling4good in 2022 However, several members subcontracted work through their respective organisations. Total turnover in 2022 was 23'614 CHF which does not capture the value provided by the organisation. The main reason why there was a dip in turnover is that we introduced the possibility that mandates conducted by our active members can also run under the brand of scaling4good independent of actual financial flows. Volunteering hours were more than 500 in 2022. 2022 closed with a loss of 2,180CHF.

# **THE PEOPLE**



## Katrin Hauser

Katrin is driven by her fascination and love for nature and people. For her nature and social structures are both robust and fragile

## Dr. Daniel Zimmer

Daniel, co-founder of scaling4good, is convinced that today's priority is action and that we cannot wait any longer to

implement the transitions required. Discourse is key to change the mindset, but action needs to follow. His work on water and climate change at global level has also convinced him of two things: first, that all planetary threats are interdependent and need to be tackled jointly; and second, that a good articulation between global and local issues and actions is key. He is also passionate about mobilizing a large diversity of people in a positive way in order to stimulate their consciousness and willingness to act.

# Dr. Salomon Billeter

<u>Salomon</u> is determined to provide a solid basis for sustainable action, having seen how small changes can make a

large difference to complex dynamic systems. He has spent his professional life developing calculation methods to understand and influence such processes: first biochemical reactions, then charge transfers in microelectronics and recently economic, societal, and judicial processes affecting liability. Having grown up in a beautiful place with enough food and clean water, surrounded by caring people, he has a lot to be grateful for and to return. But how to move from a small scale to a potentially global scale? Encouraged by William R. White's call for better models, he has used a short sabbatical in 2016 to get the simulation model for sustainability started.



## Diego Hangartner

Diego has dedicated over thirty years to external scientific research and internal meditative exploration of the mind and

consciousness. He started as a pharmacologist specializing in psychopharmacology and addiction, always interested in what constitutes a healthy mind and how to cultivate it. He spent many years at the Institute of Buddhist Dialectics in India, studying, translating and publishing several Tibetan works, and organizing several large events with His Holiness the Dalai Lama in Europe. Diego was COO of <u>Mind and Life Institute</u> in the US and co-founder and director of Mind and Life Institute in Europe until 2015.
